## **General Assembly to Convene January 10**

The General Assembly will be convened on January 10 for a special session. On January 9th & 10th, education advocates hope to impress upon lawmakers the impending crisis they have created for all local school budgets. A new unfunded mandate by the Legislature caps class sizes in kindergarten through 3rd grade.

Without state funding, local Boards of Education must pay for this requirement entirely using local funds appropriated by local County Commissions. Paying for the extra teachers, the additional classroom space and all the teaching materials would all need to come out of already -tight local coffers. Members are urged to contact their Senators and Representatives before and during this special session. Those who live close to Raleigh are also encouraged to join other education advocates at the General Assembly on January 10 in front of the legislative building to go visit Legislators. Together we can make a difference!


