about the project. "Citizens from Robeson County, part of Region VI, suffered the greatest devastation. Presently, most of the families have returned to their homes and have attempted to make their transition back to normalcy. Yet for others, the move back to their residences has been a very slow and grueling process. Some of the families moving back to their homes are experiencing difficulties and are trying to provide the basic necessities to survive. This project will assist displaced families in Robeson County with some of the relief they need. Items such as appliances, furniture, and bedding are big needs. Region VI will be working closely with United Way of Robeson County to make sure all children and their families obtain the items they need. Contributions are desired and will be appreciated."

Congratulations to Dr. Kimberly Elliott

The Jackson County Board of Education is pleased to announce that it has chosen Dr. Kimberly Elliott to serve as the new Superintendent of Schools beginning February 2, 2018. Dr. Elliott was one of 4 finalists interviewed for the position by the School Board. According to the Board Chairman, Mr. Ken Henke, "We are blessed to have Dr. Elliott serving at the helm of the Jackson County Public Schools. The School Board conducted a thorough search and ultimately realized that the experience, talent and vision we need from a Superintendent was already sit-

ting in that chair serving as the Interim Superintendent." He added, "We look forward to working with her to advance the good work being done in the Jackson County Public Schools."

The oath of office was administered by Cora Fields. Dr. Elliott was accompanied by her daughter Brynn Green and her husband Bill Elliott. Kim became a member of Alpha Iota in 2015. Her daughter Brynn is an upcoming Alpha Iota new member candidate .

Dr. Elliott is completing her fifth year with the Jackson County Public Schools ("JCPS"). She has served JCPS as an Assistant Superintendent, Associate Superintendent and most recently as the Interim Superintendent. Dr. Elliott has been a public school administrator in North Carolina since 1999.

Dr. Elliott has a long history of partnership development, strategic planning, grant management, fiscal management, program evaluation, and most importantly teaching and learning. She is focused on student success and educational interventions partnered with professional learning communities. She is relationship driven and believes strongly in the use of collaboration with families and communities to create school systems of excellence. With regards to her appointment, Dr. Elliott is motivated by student success: "As Superintendent, I intend to foster, support and challenge our educators to surpass recent milestones and to ensure that the best interest of every student is our guiding principle in decision making. I want to thank the Board of Education for their confidence in me and I am humbled to serve the staff, students and families as the Superintendent of the Jackson County Public Schools."

Dr. Elliott's appointment is effective February 2, 2018 and her initial contract is for a four year term.
