Hotel registration is going well for the 2016 Eta State Convention in Winston- Salem, April 22-24. Members who have not made reservations yet are encouraged to do so soon. Eta State Executive Secretary Dr. Barbara Perry-Sheldon offers these hints to making the check-in and check-out process during convention time go more smoothly.

"When members make reservations, it will help at check-in and check-out if they state who their roommates are and even give both credit cards," said Dr. Perry-Sheldon. "Also, it always saves time to monitor one's room for billing errors during the convention rather than waiting until checkout on Sunday when everyone is trying to checkout. Corrections, if needed, can be made daily; then fast checkout can be done. It is also important to realize that when everyone arrives to check in at 3 p.m., any hotel staff and those handling parking will be busy. Convention planners are working with the Marriott to try to make everyone's experience as positive as possible." Rooms are \$119, single or double, plus taxes. Deadline for the group rate is March 22, and as in the past, rooms will go fast, so register early. There is a charge for parking in the city deck.
