NC DKG Leaders Selected for International Positions



Dr. Teresa Cowan (*Region XI, Alpha Phi*), immediate NC DKG past president, was elected as the Southeast Regional Director during the 2022 DKG Convention in New Orleans. Teresa, outgoing chair of the DKG Communications and Marketing Committee, will lead the 11-state south-

east region on the Administrative Board.

Scholarships—One of the Benefits of DKG Membership

As many as 31 scholarships are awarded each year through the <u>DKG International Educators Foundation</u> to members pursuing advanced degrees. The next deadline to apply is **February 1**. Now is the time for members to begin preparing applications.

Scholarships for those seeking graduate studies are \$6,000 and a doctorate is \$10,000. Applicants need to have been an active member of the Society for a minimum of three years if pursuing doctoral studies or at least one year at the time of application if pursuing other graduate studies.

To apply, a member should complete the <u>current applica-</u> <u>tion form</u> found on the DKG website, request appropriate transcripts, obtain status of program documentation, and secure letters of recommendation. She will send the application as an e-mail attachment to Society Headquarters by February 1.
